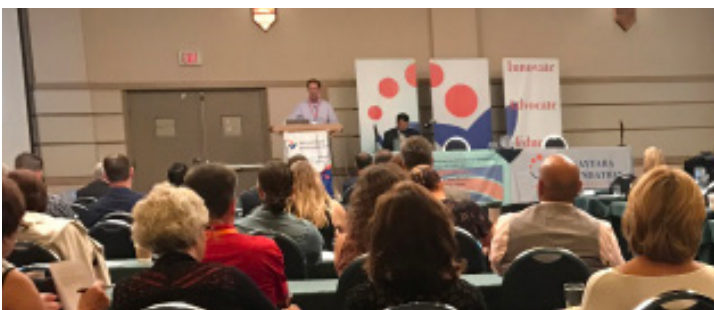

## Abstract submission deadline: Monday, January 15, 2018

Anyone who has interest in cancer health disparities and would like to showcase their work with other professionals with similar interest can submit their project reports, clinical research, or basic science research related to cancer health disparities.

Project managers, public-health students, community health educators, and others involved and interested in cancer health disparities are welcome to submit their project reports, case studies or other research for presentation at #SCHD18.

**Five travel awards are available for top scoring abstracts.**

### What's the requirement?

- Abstracts should not have been previously published or presented at another conference
- Abstracts must be written in English in the format provided
- Abstracts should be 300 words or less
- All authors' names, credentials, institutional affiliation, and email addresses must be listed.

**You don't have to be a healthcare provider to present your abstract at #SCHD18.**
